Brain Injury Research


No two brains are the same, especially injured brains. Like many diagnoses, brain injury lies on a spectrum, mild to severe. Males and females also may respond differently to brain injury.

Neurobiologist, Ramesh Raghupathi from Drexel University and his colleagues found that male mice tended to suffer depressive behaviors rather than their female counterparts, exhibited more headache-like symptoms. Raghupathi also found differences on a molecular level that could better explain sex difference in TBI responses.

The male mice had more dopamine transmission or the body's message center. Previous research has indicated that impaired dopamine signaling can lead to depression. Raghupathi and his team continue to research the effects of TBI on mice by using swimming tests and filament or a threadlike fiber to touch the faces of the animals and record their sensitivity as a measurement of headache-like symptoms.

A different study was conducted to determine if there was a difference in cognitive functioning (processing speed, executive functioning and memory) after a TBI as it relates to gender. 83 males and 74 females with mild to severe TBI were studied. Females scored much higher on tests of visual memory. No other differences were found.

COVID-19: Mask up friends!


DVRC continues to take all the preventative measures to ensure the health and safety of our residents and staff. Our residents are going on “social distancing” outings and trips again.
